Temporary Framework

DG-Competition: Compensation Schemes (examples)

- a. Cancellation of events related to COVID-19 (DK)
- b. Support measure for the congress and fair industry (IT)
- c. Compensation of fairs and congresses (DE)

















Specific Support (COVD-19):

- 2. Compensation under article 107(3)(b) (TFEU)
 - **Temporary Framework**
 - a. Direct Grants
 - b. State guarantees for loans
 - c. Subsidised public loans to companies
 - d. Deferral of tax payments / social security contributions
 - e. Targeted support: wage subsidies for employees
 - f. Support for uncovered costs

















Specific Support (COVD-19):

- 3. General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER)
 - **Article 53: Delivering Cultural Services**
 - a. Exemption from the notification requirements (TF)
 - b. Investment aid: difference eligible costs / operating profit reasonable profit up to 150 million / year
 - c. Operating aid: difference operating losses / operating costs up to 75 million/year
 - d. Aid under 2 million: 80% eligible costs

















Specific Support (COVD-19):

- 4. Cultural Sector
 - Support that is not regarded as "state aid"
 - a. Cultural activity that is accessible to the general public
 - b. Predominately state financing: >50%
 - c. Unique cultural conservation activities
 - d. General measures benefitting all undertakings
 - e. No effect on trade: De minimis (200.000 over three years)
 - f. Local events unlikely to attract customers from other MS

















European Legislation & Initiatives

Directive on Transparent and Predictable Working Conditions
New rights for all workers

- a. Information on essential aspects of work
- b. Limits to length of probationary periods
- c. Right to seek additional employment (part/full-time)
- d. In due time: notification when work will take place
- e. Anti-abuse legislation for zero contract work
- f. Written reply by transfer request to a more secure job
- g. Cost-free mandatory training = employer duty
